Terror Attack

Hijacked Jets Fly Into Trade Center, Pentagon



Two hijacked commercial jets slammed into the World Trade Center towers in New York City, and a third jet crashed into the Pentagon in Washington, D.C., on Thursday, Sept. 11, 2001, in a coordinated terrorist attack that killed thousands of people and caused billions of dollars in damage.

The attacks, which were the deadliest in U.S. history, were carried out by al-Qaeda, a radical Islamic group led by Osama bin Laden. The hijackers used four commercial airliners as weapons, crashing them into the World Trade Center towers, the Pentagon and a field near Shanksville, Pa.

The World Trade Center towers, which were the tallest buildings in the world at the time, were completely destroyed. The Pentagon, which is the headquarters of the U.S. Department of Defense, was severely damaged. The crash site near Shanksville was a small, unimproved airfield.

The attacks shocked the world and led to a global war on terrorism. The U.S. launched military operations in Afghanistan and Iraq to destroy al-Qaeda and its base of operations. 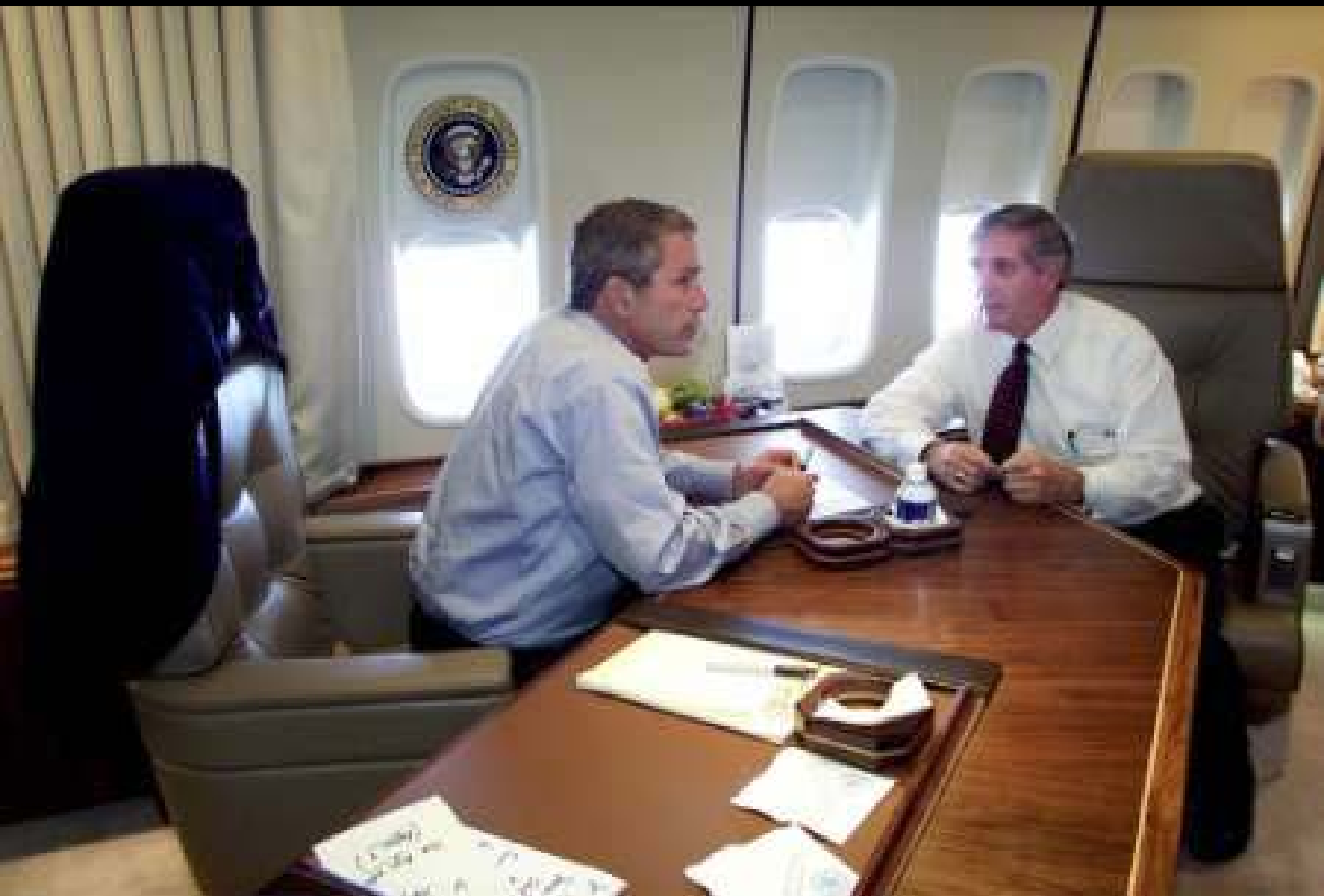
